Explain, in detail, the ways in which you would use **five** directing concepts in this scene to highlight the key theme(s) to an audience in performance. These must be related to the first part of this question.

2. **As a director**, describe, in detail, **five** moments which highlight the social and/or historical context of your selected text. You must use textual references from the play to help you justify your answer.

Explain, in detail, the ways in which you would use **five** directing concepts to highlight the social and/or historical context to an audience in performance. These must be related to the first part of this question.

3. **As an actor**, choose a character from your selected text. Describe, in detail, **five** moments that highlight this character's emotions. You must use textual references from the play to help you justify your answer.

Explain, in detail, the ways in which you would use **five** acting concepts to convey this character's emotions to an audience in performance. These must be related to the first part of this question.

4. **As an actor**, choose a character from your selected text whose actions you would consider to be weak and/or strong. Describe, in detail, **five** moments when the character shows this weakness and/or strength. You must use textual references from the play to help you justify your answer.

Explain, in detail, the ways in which you would use **five** acting concepts to portray the weak and/or strong actions of the character to an audience in performance. These must be related to the first part of this question.

5. As a designer, describe, in detail, **five ways** the closing scene of your selected text is important. You must use textual references from the play to help you justify your answer.

Explain, in detail, the ways in which you would use **five** design concepts to highlight the importance of this scene to an audience in performance. These must be related to the first part of this question.

6. As a designer, describe in detail, the moods and/or atmospheres of **five** moments in your selected text. You must use textual references from the play to help you justify your answer.

Explain, in detail, the ways in which you would use **five** design concepts to help communicate these moods and/or atmospheres to an audience in performance. These must be related to the first part of this question.
