### **Question Paper Finalised Marking Instructions**

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#### General marking principles for Higher French Reading

Always apply these general principles. Use them in conjunction with the detailed marking instructions, which identify the key features required in candidates' responses.

- (a) Always use positive marking. This means candidates accumulate marks for the demonstration of relevant skills, knowledge and understanding; marks are not deducted for errors or omissions.
- (b) If a candidate response does not seem to be covered by either the principles or detailed marking instructions, and you are uncertain how to assess it, you must seek guidance from your team leader.
- (c) Award a mark for each answer. Marks are not transferable between questions and the answers for each question must come from the item.
- (d) Marks are available as follows:
  - (i) The first set of questions (worth 18 marks in total) asks candidates to provide answers based on comprehension of information from the text. There are generally 1-3 marks available for each question.
  - (ii) The penultimate question is the overall purpose question, and candidates must identify the overall purpose of the text and draw meaning from their overall understanding of the text. There is a maximum of 2 marks available for reference to the text and detailed comment. Pegged mark descriptors (2/1/0) and associated commentary are available, along with further guidance, in the detailed marking instructions.
  - (iii) The last question is the translation. For this question, candidates must translate the underlined section of the text. The section for translation is divided into five sense units. For each sense unit, award 2, 1 or 0 marks: 2 marks for a full translation, 1 for partial translation, and 0 for an unsuccessful attempt.
- (e) Award marks according to the accuracy and relevance of the candidate's answers. Award marks where the answer is accurate but expressed in their own words.

Assertion (1 mark) Yes, the writer is in favour of young people having summer jobs because the text is (mainly/mostly/generally/slightly/broadly) positive/states more advantages than disadvantages/has lots of positive language.  Award 0 marks for assertion where the candidate states: The writer is not in favour of young people having summer jobs. OR The writer is neutral.  Justification (1 mark)  Angèle says that it is important for young people to learn the value of money from a young age  the term "profiter" is used in the title, suggesting that work can have an element of fun and enjoyment  there are lots of opportunities for earning money, the list of jobs in agriculture suggests many possibilities  the real-life example he uses, Angèle, is very positive about her experience of working during the summer  the writer says that working is character-building  the writer points out specific working conditions which protect young people	2	Award 2 marks where the candidate provides a clear answer, with justification that shows an accurate reading of the text.  Award 1 mark where the candidate provides an answer which may contain some degree of misreading, but which offers evidence of some justification.  Award 0 marks where the candidate simply provides information to be found in the text by simply re-stating answers to previous questions.

Award a mark for each sense unit, as follows:  2 marks - good The candidate understands and conveys essential information and relevant details, clearly and accurately, with appropriate use of English.  1 mark - satisfactory The candidate understands and conveys essential information clearly and comprehensibly, although some of the details may be translated in an imprecise or inaccurate manner. They convey the key message in spite of inaccuracies and weaknesses in the use of English.  0 marks - unsatisfactory The candidate fails to demonstrate sufficient understanding of the essential idea.
